

# INSTRUCTIONS FOR COLLECTING SURGICAL PATHOLOGY (HISTOLOGY) SPECIMENS

## **PATIENT PREPARATION**

No patient preparation is required.

#### **LABEL THE SPECIMEN**

Patient's complete first and last name (no nicknames or initials), specimen source, and date of time of collection MUST be on the plus one of the following unique patient identifiers:

- 1. Patient's date of birth.
- 2. Requisition number.
- 3. Medical record number / chart number

## **COMPLETE THE REQUISITION**

- 1. Patient's first and last name. Do not use nicknames.
- 2. Patient's date of birth.
- 3. First and last name of the requesting physician.
- 4. Test requested.
- 5. Specimen source.
- 6. Date and time of collection.
- 7. Include pertinent patient history.
- 8. ICD 10 code(s)
- 9. Billing information (client, patient, 3<sup>rd</sup> party)

#### **COLLECTION OF TISSUE SPECIMENS:**

- 1. Tissue specimens must be placed in buffered 10% formalin immediately.
- 2. Formalin should cover the entire specimen.
- 3. *DO NOT ALLOW SPECIMENS TO DRY*. Note: If the specimen cannot be placed in formalin immediately, place the tissue in a sponge or towel moistened with saline.
- 4. If transportation to the laboratory will be overnight, the surgeon should open large specimens so formalin will contact the endometrium of the uterus or lumen of the bowel. Note: Care should be taken so excessive dissection does not interfere with the pathology examination.

#### **COLLECTION OF OTHER SPECIMENS:**

#### AMPUTATED LIMBS

Keep specimen cool. Fixative not required

## **CALCULI** (Kidney or Bladder Stones)

Submit dry without a fixative.

Place in a sterile plastic container or a plain red top clot tube.

## ESTROGEN AND PROGESTERONE RECEPTOR AND PLOIDY STUDIES

Frozen specimens are not required.

Studies are performed on paraffin blocks of formalin fixed tissues.

## MICROBIOLOGY STUDIES

Call Microbiology for collection instructions.

Specimens should not be exposed to formalin.

## **CYTOGENETIC STUDIES**

Place specimen in a sterile container.

Refrigerate. Do not freeze.

Studies are performed at Munroe Meyer Institute and PLS will transport specimen to them.
